- ✓ Test alarms monthly.

2. PLACE FIRE EXTINGUISHERS within reach on every level of your home!




- ✓ Install a fire extinguisher within reach on every floor, close to exits, and in the kitchen and garage.
- ✓ Include all locations where a fire could potentially start.
- ✓ Check the gauge monthly to be sure it is pressurized.
- ✓ Always call the fire department before you try to extinguish a fire yourself.
- ✓ Replace fire extinguishers that are over 12 years old or after use.

3. INSTALL CARBON MONOXIDE ALARMS on each floor & near bedrooms!



- ✓ Look for the UL Listed symbol to be sure the alarm meets quality standards.
- ✓ Test alarms monthly.
- ✓ Install and operate fuel-burning appliances & heating systems properly. Schedule annual inspections with a professional.
- ✓ Replace outdated alarms with Kidde Worry-Free 10-year sealed battery alarms.



- 1. Pull the pin**
- 2. Aim at the base of the fire**
- 3. Squeeze the handle**
- 4. Sweep from side to side**



4. CREATE A HOME FIRE ESCAPE PLAN WITH YOUR FAMILY



- Gather at the table together with some drawing supplies.
- Draw a map of your home. Show all doors and windows.
- Visit each room. Find two ways out.
- All windows and doors should open easily. You should be able to use them to get outside.
- Make sure your home has smoke alarms. Push the test button to make sure each alarm is working.
- Pick a meeting place outside. It should be in front of your home.
- Make sure your house or building number can be seen from the street.
- Practice your home fire escape drill at night and during the day.
