WHEREAS, Dave E. Hackbarth, born in Appleton, Wisconsin and reared in Brookfield, Wisconsin, graduated from Brookfield Central High School in 1978; and

WHEREAS, Dave graduated from Winona State University in Minnesota, majoring in mathematics and statistics with a minor in business administration; and

WHEREAS, Dave resides in Louisville, Kentucky with his wife, Bonnie, and two daughters, Chelsea and Victoria; and

WHEREAS, Dave has been employed with the U.S. Census Bureau for 33 years; 20 of which have been at the National Processing Center of the U.S. Census Bureau. Dave became Director on April 06, 2006 and was responsible for directing the Decennial kits to enumerators across the United States to areas such as the Regional Office for the state of Wisconsin. He was also responsible for the processing of survey forms that include Agricultural Census. That survey also included the Brookfield area of Wisconsin. Now his staff is preparing for the major U.S. Census Decennial that affects every portion of the United States; and

WHEREAS, The National Processing Center features over 1 million square feet of data processing space. It is the second largest employer in southern Indiana, averaging approximately 2,000 workers. Peak employment reached 5,500 during Census 2010; and

WHEREAS, Dave has proven to be a tremendous leader both at the Census Bureau and in the community. Through the years he has worked diligently with staff, including assisting the staff in building the Decennial Kits (over 7 million); and

WHEREAS, After many years of dedicated service to the U.S. Census Bureau, Dave will retire on April 27, 2018;


